Supervisor McConnell prepared a slide presentation that outlined the 2024 Preliminary Budget.

- 2024 Service Funding Priorities: (1) Town Highway Department: Continuing the 2023 3 year rolling equipment replacement plan initiative to reduce annual operating cost; Highway employee reach industry standard pay rates or better (2) LaFayette Ambulance Service: Continuing the 2023 initiative to build to a 24/7/365 Town

ambulance service. (3) LaFayette Fire Department: To replace an aging “pumper fleet” due to no public water to fight fires.

- The General Fund which includes: Payroll, Buildings, Printing & Mailing, Street Lighting, Youth Programs, Refuse, Planning & Zoning Boards, and the Justice Court Clerks/ Judges, has decreased by \$0.54/1k; 18.77%
- The Library Fund increased by \$0.02/1k; 3.65% due an increase of the minimum wage/ worker’s compensation.
- The Highway Fund which includes: general repairs, improvements, machinery, employee benefits & snow removal increased by \$0.584/1k; 23.95%
- LaFayette Fire Department budget which includes: Fire protection, equipment, pension fund, building upkeep/renovation increased by \$0.01/1k;2.24% due to a building renovation.
- LaFayette Ambulance includes salaries, employee benefits, vehicles, equipment increased to \$0.26/1k; 36% due to employee hiring for more coverage. Currently coverage equals 100 hrs./week
- Jamesville Fire budget includes fire protection, equipment, pension, building upkeep remained the same as 2023 at \$0.12/1k; 0%
- Town Grants for 2023-2024: (1) Onondaga County Community Development Grant - \$25k to replace Stafford Park Playground equipment; Grant Awards - NY Main Street award (1) \$300k LaFayette Hotel Building Stabilization Grant (2) Restore NY Grant - \$1.6 M LaFayette Hotel Building Rehabilitation (3) Onondag County HUD Grant - \$100k for Community Center Refurbishment
- ARPA \$120k allocated for 2024 / The purchase of 4 solar powered speed limit control signs (2 in the hamlet on Route 20 & 2 on Route 11 N near the high school. Remaining ARPA funds \$200,216.47 by December 2026.
- Overall Town Budget Costs: NYS Tax Cap Rate set at 2% with a 0.3% growth factor; Town of LaFayette 2024 Tax Rate set at 4.7%; The town did not meet the NYS Tax Cap Mandate; Tax rate effect on residents increase of \$8.23/100k assessed value.

**Authorizing the implementation and funding of the costs of a transportation project, which may be eligible for federal-aid and/or state-aid, or reimbursement from Bridge NY funds.**

WHEREAS, a project for the Clark Hollow Rd over Cascade Creek Bridge Replacement, BIN 2257720, Town of LaFayette, Bridge NY 2022, P.I.N. 3757.27 ("the Project") is eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S. Code, as amended and PUB. L. 117-58, also known as the "Bipartisan Infrastructure Law ("BIL"); and

WHEREAS, the Town of LaFayette will design, let, and construct the Project: and

WHEREAS, the Town of LaFayette desires to advance the Project by making a commitment of 100% of the costs of the work for Engineering, ROW, and Construction.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Town of LaFayette Board, duly convened does hereby

RESOLVE, that the Town of LaFayette Board hereby approves the above-subject Project; and it is hereby further

RESOLVED, that the Town of LaFayette Board hereby authorizes the Town of LaFayette to pay 100% of the cost of Engineering, ROW, and Construction work for the Project or portions thereof, with the understanding that qualified costs may be eligible for federal-aid, state-aid, or reimbursement from Bridge NY funds; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the sum of \$1,809,850 is hereby appropriated from future bond resolution or resolutions and made available to cover the cost of participation in the above phase(s) of the Project; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town of LaFayette Board hereby agrees that the Town shall be responsible for all costs of the Project which exceed the amount of federal-aid, state-aid, or NY Bridge funding awarded to the Town of LaFayette; and it is further

RESOLVED, that in the event the Project costs not covered by federal-aid, state-aid, or NY Bridge funding exceed the amount appropriated above, the Town of LaFayette Board shall convene as soon as possible to appropriate said excess amount immediately upon the notification by the Town of LaFayette Supervisor; and it is further

RESOLVED, that Town of LaFayette hereby agrees that construction of the Project shall begin no later than twenty-four (24) months after award and the construction phase of the Project shall be completed within thirty (30) months; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town of LaFayette Supervisor be and is hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the Town of LaFayette all necessary agreements, certifications or reimbursement requests for federal-aid and/or state-aid with the New York State Department of Transportation in connection with the advancement or approval of the Project and providing for the administration of the Project

and the Town of LaFayette's funding of Project costs and permanent funding of the local share of federal-aid and state-aid eligible Project costs and all Project costs within appropriations therefore that are not so eligible; and it is further

RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be filed with the New York State Commissioner of Transportation by attaching it to any necessary Agreement in connection with the Project; and it is further

RESOLVED, this Resolution shall take effect immediately.
